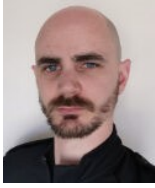

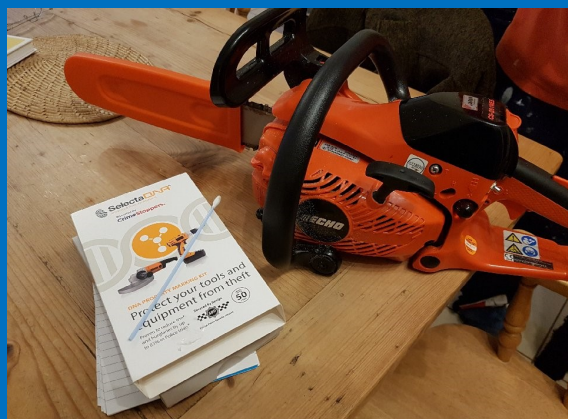
Thank you to our Mystery Knitter in Porlock for our Elf he is sitting with his friend in our office.
