Speeding

We are listening to your concerns and we have had discussions with Road Policing and we are in the process of arranging speed reduction alerts for one village in particular. Plus other areas are being monitored through our speed detection units.

If at all possible it needs to be reported at the time but if not possible after is ok, please provide as much detail as you can registration and description or name of the driver if known.
