<i>Achillea</i> 'Pomegranate' 	<p>A fabulous achillea which flowers for much longer than the usual varieties. Clusters of rich raspberry-pink flowers, which don't fade, are produced over many weeks in summer. Shorter and stockier than some other achilleas. <i>Ammi majus</i> 	<p>Delicate, frothy annual with umbels of small white flowers through the summer. A beautiful, airy plant, easy to grow. <i>Anisodonteia capensis</i> 	<p>The Cape mallow is a small shrub which clothes itself in beautiful pink flowers, with darker pink centres, all summer long. It has survived outside over the winter here at Crockford, but in a sheltered spot. I think it's one of the prettiest summer plants. AGM.</p> <p>Full sun. <i>Astilbe 'Sprite'</i> 	<p>It's hard to convey the prettiness of this plant in a photo. It has exquisitely dissected glossy green foliage and sprays of intricate shell-pink flowers which froth starrily in summer. Shorter than other astilbes. <i>Aster 'Purple Dome'</i> 	<p>Now called <i>Symphyotrichum</i>, but 'aster' is easier! <i>Astrantia 'Roma'</i> 	<p>Hardy, clump-forming perennial, known as the pincushion flower. <i>Astrantia</i> 'Venice' 	<p>'Venice' produces strong mid-pink flowers with a ruff of darker bracts. Very attractive to pollinators, it repeat flowers through out the summer if deadheaded once in a while. <i>Calamagrostis x acut.</i> 'Karl Foerster' 	<p>This sterile grass can be used as a hedge, it's so rigidly upright. It's equally good as a vertical accent in a perennial border. The stiff stems are remarkably weather resistant and remain intact throughout the winter, creating an eye-catching silhouette in the garden. Drought tolerant, does not self-seed or run. <i>Crocasmia</i> 'Hellfire' 	<p>I much prefer this crocasmia to <i>C. 'Lucifer'</i>, which by comparison is brash in colour, somewhat invasive and prone to falling over. 'Hellfire' is shorter, at around 80cm, and its flowers are a rich, velvety red. Easy to grow and not invasive. <i>Crocasmia</i> 'Zeal Giant' 	<p>A super-tall crocasmia bred by Terry Jones in Devon. Upward-facing, intense orange flowers with darker stripes on the lower petals are produced in July and August. <p><i>Hesperantha coccinea</i> 'Major'</p> 	<p>Used to be called <i>Schizostylis</i>. Strappy leaves and stiff, upright stems of large, coral red, gladiolus-like flowers from late August to October. This is thriving here at Crockford. To do well it needs a slightly sheltered spot that doesn't dry out too much in summer. The luminous colour looks glorious amid the tints of autumn. <p><i>Iris</i> 'Dark Aura'</p> 	<p>A marginal water iris, perfect for softening the edges of a pond. The unique feature of 'Dark Aura' is a strong dark purple flush on the emerging leaves, which remains at the base as the leaf grows. Velvety, rich violet flowers in late spring/early summer. <i>Lysimachia</i> 'Candela' 	<p>Copper-flushed green foliage and spires of pure white flowers from June onwards. 'Candela' is a dwarf form of <i>lysimachia</i>, clump-forming and reliable. <i>Monarda</i> 'Raspberry Wine' 	<p>A sumptuous plant with maroon-flushed bracts beneath rich raspberry pink flower-heads. Aromatic foliage. <i>Ophiopogon plan.</i> 'Nigrescens' 	<p>Commonly known as black lilyturf, an unusual foliage plant for shady areas. It grows well in pots, as well as amongst shrubs in the border. Looks amazing in spring when interplanted with snowdrops or white wood anemones. Small purple flowers produced in summer are followed by black berries. <i>Penstemon</i> 'Firebird' 	<p>A free-flowering shrubby perennial which produces spikes of tubular coral-pink flowers. <i>Persicaria</i> 'Fat Domino' 	<p>Long, fat spikes of rich red flowers carried on slender stems above large, mid-green leaves. <i>Salvia greggii</i> (pink) 	<p>Upright, shrubby habit. Rich red-pink flowers are borne on long stems all summer. Aromatic foliage. I overwinter mine outside in the ground, but cuttings take easily if you want spares. Ideal for pots for summer, grows quickly. <i>Salvia 'Nachtvlinder'</i> 	<p>Upright but lax habit, with long flowering stems and blackcurrant-scented, aromatic foliage. Velvety-purple flowers are produced from June to October. It has a very regular, radiating growth habit, which eventually trails, and small pale pink flowers in summer. Has gone through winter outside with no trouble. Drought tolerant. <i>Sedum</i> 'Thunderhead' 	<p>Stout upright stems of bronzed green foliage support huge, deep rose flower heads that look like summer thunderhead clouds. It flowers continuously from late spring through to autumn, if the old flowering stems are removed. Forms a large, leafy clump. Mine grows right up to a tree-trunk, so it's very tough.
