

#### **Drug Dealing**

Are you aware of Drug dealing in your community? if so please contact the police on 101 and or report via Crimestoppers 0800555111.

You can report to your local beat team via the facebook messenger system. Or online via the website. All incidents will be recorded and intelligence submitted the more information we can obtain can lead to gaining evidence and dealing with the individuals.

#### **Drink Driving**

We take drink driving very seriously. If you have concerns that someone you know may be drinking and driving, please report it at the time if possible or as general information giving the name/details of the driver and the registration/make of the vehicle. You can make the report via 101 (999 if ongoing), via an online report or by contacting Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.

PCSO's will be visiting the local schools for their Superhero days where the PCSO's are invited into the schools to meet with the children a police car is taken in and the children get to sit in the car and try on uniform. We speak a little about Road safety and it's great for the children each year to see a friendly face and associate us as someone they can come to if they need to and not to be scared of us.
