If not – please do. With so many visitors to our area, making a call to the NHS to locate the nearest defibrillator could save a life.


Registering a defibrillator does not cost anything at all, and the process is now simpler than ever - all defibrillators should now be registered on "The Circuit", a new database set up by the NHS in conjunction with Microsoft & the British Heart Foundation.

Just search "The Circuit" and add yours to the map!





This will ensure if people ring NHS to establish the nearest Defib then the location can be given.

This is our focus on preventing Drink Driving, there will be extra checks at the roadside for motorists to ensure that over this festive season people are driving safely and not after consuming Alcohol.

Combating Drink Driving

August and December are peak months for collisions involving offences of drink and drug driving. In response to this, proactive operations are conducted across the Avon and Somerset area, focussing on detecting drink and drug driving offences, targeting prolific offenders, promoting road safety, educating members of the public, enforcing road traffic legislation, and ultimately denying criminals the use of our roads.

Last year's Op Tonic was a huge success, with 245 drink and drug drivers arrested in December 2021. Within our force area we dealt with four fatal collisions in December 2021, two of which had intoxicants as a factor. Behind every statistic is a story of a life taken too soon and the impact on many other lives, which will never be the same again.

We want people to behave responsibly by not drinking and driving, looking out for each other and encouraging friends and family not to drive if they plan to drink.

You can anonymously **report a suspected drink/drugs driver.**

Drug Dealing

You can report to your local beat team via the facebook messenger system. Or online via the website. All incidents will be recorded and intelligence submitted the more information we can obtain can lead to gaining evidence and dealing with the individuals.

Drink Driving

We take drink driving very seriously. If you have concerns that someone you know may be drinking and driving, please report it at the time if possible or as general information giving the name/details of the driver and the registration/make of the vehicle. You can make the report via 101 (999 if ongoing), via an online report or by contacting Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.

Speeding
